**Candidates Eligibility**

The participants are expected to have the following qualifications:

| <b>1. Current position</b> | The participants should either in the mid or senior level management and working under rural development and poverty alleviation, rural entrepreneurship development, small and medium industries and other relevant departments of national and local government agencies. |
| <b>2. Work experience</b>  | At least five (5) years of experience in the position described above.  |
| <b>3. Education</b>        | University degree or equivalent qualification from a recognized University/ Institution.  |
| <b>4. Language</b>         | The workshop will be conducted in English, and participants are frequently required to make oral and written presentations. They must, therefore, be proficient in spoken and written English.  |
| <b>5. Health</b>           | Participants to complete a number of individual and group activities, and strenuous fieldwork. It is therefore, recommended to the member countries, not to nominate candidates who are likely to suffer from physical and mental stress.                                   |



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**Country Presentation**

The workshop is on Sufficiency Economy Philosophy and One Tambon One Product (*one village one product*) Programme, and there will be a session on Experience Sharing among CMCs. Hence, participants are requested to prepare a **Presentation** expressing the status of their respective country in this thematic area.

The presentation time for each participant will be ten (10) minutes, so it's requested to prepare presentation adjusting with the allocated time, and **submit by 30 June 2018 to [training@cirdap.org](mailto:training@cirdap.org)**

An ideal presentation may content the section briefly:

- a. **Governing structure** (description of governing system of the government and its institute/s);
- b. **Rules/ regulations/ policies /strategies** (a brief of existing or proposed rules- regulations- policies- plan and strategies on cited issues);
- c. **Present practices** (a brief description on present practices on sufficiency economy philosophy and one village one product concept. Participants can share their best practices);
- d. **Limitations, challenges and opportunities** (Participant will identify specific limitation- challenges- opportunities have in his/her own country's perspective); and
- e. **Way forwards** (Participant may point out his/her own idea to way forward as their country's limitation- challenges and way of utilizing the opportunities. S/he may generate idea to implement the programme concept in his/her own country for poverty alleviation and rural development).
- f. **Others** (Participants are free to write any other issues - related or relevant with the workshop topic, in the context of their own countries perspective).

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**Financial Arrangements**

**(i) To be borne by participants or participating countries**

- a. Participants' insurance premiums: All participants are expected to be fully insured against accident and illness (including hospitalization and death) for the entire duration of the workshop and travel. Neither the CIRDAP nor the Royal Thai Government will be responsible for any eventuality arising from accident or illness.
- b. All expenses related to visa fees, DSA.
- c. All other expenditure relating to travel within the applicant(s) country and in transit, miscellaneous expenses etc.

**(ii) To be borne by the CIRDAP-Ministry of Agriculture and Cooperatives, Thailand**

- a. Local hospitality including board, lodging and transport for the participants;
- b. Air fare of the most economical direct route between the international airport nearest to the participants' place of work and workshop venue. Participants are requested to purchase the air ticket, which will be reimbursed with the boarding pass and the invoice of the air ticket in the workshop (in Thai Currency only)
