

## Rural Development Context of Fiji

- Sustainable rural development challenged by:-
  - Distance from trade markets;
  - Domination of agricultural economy;
  - High reliance on official development assistance;
  - Capability of rural work force to contribute to economic and social changes that is part and parcel of development;
  - Environmental vulnerabilities.






#### Cause for Innovative Rural Development

- Tremendous potential for Fiji's rural economy to contribute to national socio-economic development.
- Government falls victim to 'tunnel vision' inhibiting potential to create policies and programs that are responsive to local & current demands.
- Silo mentality: government, CSO's, private sector, & RURAL DWELLERS are not harmonizing efforts.
- Government needs to relook at the rural development environment to tease out these existing opportunities.

| Governance                                    | <ul> <li>Current rural development governance structure has had<br/>little to no reviews since 1970s.</li> </ul>  |




### Conclusion
