

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

➤ Is it mandatory to submit the innovation idea within five (5) pages?

No. The idea note can be of any length. You may submit a one-page, two-page, or longer document, as appropriate, well within 5 pages.

➤ Is submission allowed only in English?

No. Innovation ideas may be submitted in any language.

➤ Are photographs mandatory for submission?

No. Photographs are not compulsory. You may also submit diagrams, illustrations, flowcharts, or other visual representations instead if required.

➤ What is meant by “clear evidence of impact”?

The submission may present an idea or concept. You may describe the potential impact of innovation and how it is expected to benefit the community or beneficiaries.

➤ What are ‘Potential Deliverables’?

Potential deliverables refer to tangible or intangible outputs, results, or outcomes of the innovation. Examples include job creation in a village, increased household income, improved services, or enhanced capacities.

➤ Is organizational affiliation required to submit an idea?

No. Individuals may submit innovative ideas independently. Organizational affiliation is not mandatory.

➤ Does the recorded video need to be in English?

No. The video may be recorded in any language you are comfortable with.

➤ Is it mandatory to submit a biography or organizational profile along with contact details?

Yes. Contact details are mandatory. Please include your name, email address, and contact mobile number (or WhatsApp number) in the email body while submitting your innovative idea or proposal. A brief biography or organizational profile is optional.
